- Going Green: Composting Starting a pilot program to collect restaurants' and grocery stores' food waste, and bring to the existing composting facility in order to reduce municipal solid waste and cost.
- Business Development: Industrial Recycling Facility Incentivize companies to come here, and build a state-of-the-art recycling facility here in Marlborough, so that we may capitalize on a nation-level problem and reap the financial benefits to better our community.
- Pedestrian Shopping District Revitalizing Main St. and utilizing the vacant lot at the intersection of Mechanic St. and Lincoln St, to create an accessible pedestrian shopping center and fountain square off of the rail trail and support local economic activity.
- Education: Expanding Vocational Training and Student-Business Partnerships Creating job training opportunities and preparing Marlborough's youth for the current job market. We must ensure that the curriculum aligns with vocations that are in high demand, and creating partnerships with local businesses in Marlborough to guide our youth as they make career decisions for their future.
- Infrastructure: Roads and Bridges Increasing municipal funding to road and bridge repair projects, replacing the "patchwork quilt" of road surface that we currently have, and negotiating with contractors to ensure that repairs are done quickly and efficiently to minimally obstruct the lives of residents.
- Energy Initiative: Solar Infrastructure Investing in renewable energy via solar panels to lower the annual city expenditure of \$2.66 million on electricity and put these funds toward needed and worthy projects.
